AS I SEE IT

This business of forgiveness is a tough thing. People will intentionally do you wrong and hurt you in many ways. They can steal from you, lie about you, and wish misfortune upon you. What do you do when someone does you like this? You can become bitter and swear that you will never have anything else to do with that person. It is okay to separate from potential hazardous relationships. (I am not talking about marriage). However, bitterness leads to depression and that is not a road you want to travel. The Word of God says in Ephesians 4:31-32: “Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamor, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice. And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ’s sake hath forgiven you.” There it is. Because Christ has forgiven us, we are to forgive others. You say, “Dr. Hayes, you don’t know what someone has done to me.” I understand that, but I do know what they did to Christ. They crucified Him; and while they were doing it, He cried, “Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do.” As I said, this business of forgiving is a tough thing for us, but it is necessary to receive all the blessings Christ wants to bestow upon us. So, here is the question: “What if I forgive someone and they wrong me again?” Scripture gives the answer. Matthew 18:21-22: “Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I FORGIVE HIM? TILL SEVEN TIMES? Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, until seven times, but, until seventy times seven.” There’s the answer. Well, seventy times seven equals four hundred ninety. That means an unlimited amount of times. Some say, no, it means four hundred ninety times and that’s all. Let me ask, how many times have you asked Christ to forgive you in your Christian life? If you answer truthfully, it exceeds four hundred and ninety times, doesn’t it?

Have you ever wondered why Christ said, “Seventy times seven?” There is a

familiar Old Testament passage that sheds a lot of light on this. Daniel 9:24-27: “Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most Holy. Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks: the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times. And after threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not from himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; and the end thereof shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined. And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations shall make it desolate, even until the consummation and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.”

Let me explain what you just read. In 9:24 “Seventy weeks” represents seventy sevens of years. In other words, the seventy weeks represents 490 years. This sets the time for the end of Israel’s punishment. The seven weeks in verse 25 refers to the time of building the temple walls at Jerusalem. That is, it would take 49 years (7X7) to build those walls from the time the order was given to begin the project. Then there would be threescore (60) and two weeks (2) unto Messiah would come and be crucified (cut off – verse 26). That is, it would take 49 years to build the walls and 62 more weeks until Jesus Christ would come. Remember, these weeks represent a period of 7 years each. So, 62 X7 would be 434 more years. Adding the 49 years and the 434 years together, you will come to a total of 483 years from the time the order to build the walls was given to the first coming of Christ. But verse 24 said “seventy weeks” and we have only accounted for sixty-nine. Verse 27 gives the “one week” or seven years that we are missing. There is a gap between the 69th and 70th week. That gap is called the Church Age. That is the age you and I live in and no one knows how long it will last. Christ was crucified 483 years to the date after the order was given to build the walls. Then, He ascended into Heaven and has been there a little over 2,000 years. Those 2,000 years have been the day of grace for us and the ministry of the church. When Christ raptures the church, then the final week (last 7 years) will begin. That seven years is called the Tribulation period. After that 7 years is completed, we come back with Christ to fight Armageddon. So, allowing for the gap in between the 483rd year and the 490th year (the gap is the Church Age), Daniel chapter 9 sums up all the time that matters. The period is defined as seventy weeks (or 490 years). The Lord told Peter to forgive seventy times seven (490 times). That means that we forgive others as long as this world stands before Christ comes back!! It may be a hundred thousand times you have to forgive. When time is up, you cannot forgive anymore; so don’t meet your Savior without forgiving those who have wronged you.

Again, this business of forgiving is a tough thing. However, it is required by the greatest forgiver of them all --- Jesus Christ. I hope this helps you in your journey through life. Chances are, your buddy hasn’t learned this at the seminary he attends. Share this with him and let him see how we teach at Andersonville Theological Seminary. Then, maybe he will enroll and learn the Bible! That’s the way I see it. What about you?

- ❖ Current students should include name, address, and ss# or student number on each test. If you have a hyphenated name, please be sure to give the complete name on tests or when you call, write, fax, etc. We cannot find you if we do not have complete information.
- ❖ Transcripts may be requested at www.andersonvilleseminary.com by clicking on alumni on the bar at the top of the home page. Once the alumni page appears, you will see the transcript link. Print out the form and fax, mail, or email it in. The cost is \$20.00 for the first transcript and \$10.00 for any additional copies.
- ❖ Special church ceremonies, held for the purpose of displaying degrees, should not be planned until the student's degree has arrived. Most of the time, student's do not allow enough time and are disappointed when their degree does not arrive by the date of the ceremony. Degrees, once ordered, usually take 6 to 8 weeks for delivery.
- ❖ Use enough postage. Some student's are not putting enough postage on their work. The cost of getting your postage out of the post office is mounting up. The seminary is not responsible for picking up mail without proper postage.
- ❖ All students seeking to graduate by a certain date should turn in their work at least 30 days before degrees are ordered to give the grade department time to process his or her grades. The grade department handles grades for approximately 6,000 students.
- ❖ All degrees are now printed as Andersonville Theological Seminary.
- ❖ Office hours are from 9:00 until 4:00 p.m. on Monday through Thursday and from 9:00 until 12:00 on Friday. (The grade department is closed from 11:00 until 12:00 each day for lunch.) Please call for an appointment, if possible, when visiting. In the past, students have been disappointed when they stopped by on Friday afternoon and found our offices all locked up.
